Year 11 Enrichment Day

As you are aware Tuesday 15th December is enrichment day for Aldridge School. During this day Year 11 will be working on various topics in English and Mathematics. The English groups will be focussing on work related to "An Inspector Calls", this will include a theatre performance and workshops.

The structure of the day will be as follows:

<u>Morning Session</u> <u>9.00 a.m to 11.45</u>	Pupils in Lister, Edison and Darwin to go immediately to English classrooms for registration.	Pupils in Curie to go immediately to Mathematics classrooms for registration.
<u>Lunch</u> <u>11.45 to 12.15pm</u>	No pupils to leave school grounds	No pupils to leave school grounds
<u>Afternoon Session</u> <u>12.15pm to 3.00 pm</u>	Pupils in Curie to go immediately to English classrooms for registration.	Pupils in Lister, Darwin and Edison to go immediately to Mathematics classrooms for registration.

Note: In order to allow pupils better access to specialist help and assistance they may not be taught in their normal teaching groups. Comfort breaks during morning and afternoon sessions will be allowed at the discretion of the teacher in charge of that particular group.

It is expected that the day will have a more relaxed atmosphere than a normal teaching day. To this end we feel it is important to allow pupils some extra privileges.

Pupils may wear smart/casual non uniform and may bring sweets and soft drinks. Pupils are asked to be sensible in their choice of clothes and food. We are happy for pupils to bring their Ipods, MP3 players or other personnel music players for use at certain points in the day. Pupils should note that they will not be allowed to use them during the English activities or during selective activities in Mathematics. The school will not take responsibility for the loss of such items and pupils should take care to ensure the security of their valuables. Year 11 pupils should note that these privileges should not be misused.

This is a fantastic opportunity for pupils to improve on their understanding and enjoyment in Mathematics and English and we hope that they each take advantage of this time.
